



Growing Together

As I announced recently, on September 10th we will be taking a step forward in our worship life. We will move our 9:30 contemporary worship experience into our 11:00 hour, reimagining how we worship...together. In addition to uniting us as a worshiping family, this will also open the 9:45 hour for greater participation in current and new Sunday school classes. The Sunday morning schedule beginning Sept. 10th will be: 8:30 worship; 9:45 Sunday school; 11:00 worship.

I've been discussing this with the Leadership Board, music leaders, and others for two years, building on the earlier work of the Task Force. And I am convinced it is the direction God is leading Western Hills at this time. Here are some of the reasons:

Community. Jesus calls us to unity. And God has given us the gift of music, not to divide us, but to unite us in praise.

Relationships. We need to prioritize small groups and create opportunities during our prime meeting time on Sunday mornings for more people to be involved.

Tradition. The rich tradition of over 1500 years of hymnody needs to be handed on to new generations. However, those generations will not come if their own voice is not also represented.

Growth. There is as much good, God-honoring music being written today as at any time in church history. But, while some are missing out on the classics, others are missing out on "singing to the Lord a new song."

I hope you are as excited about these next steps as many of us are! If it's been a while since you've worshiped with us and/or been involved in a Sunday school class, this is a great time to jump back in. And if you are a regular worshiper, I hope you will get to know some new people in your church family. Remember, we're all in this together. See you Sunday!

Introducing the Faith 5


A time for families with children or teens to draw close to Jesus together!
