VIEWS FROM THE RIDGE

In 2009, as the beginning seeds of The Ridge were being planted, I read a book called Church Unique by Will Mancini. In it the author suggests creating a vision after watching and discerning what God is doing within your congregation, as opposed to creating your own vision within a closet with no consideration of what God is already doing within and through your community of faith. So, in 2013 a group of Ridge folks began reading and working the process of Church Unique. We asked many questions of our church, our community, and our leadership to discern The Ridge's "Kingdom Concept," or sweet spot. From there we discussed, discerned, prayed, and filtered our findings until we arrived at the direction we believe God is taking The Ridge. Below is the fruit of these labors, and our leadership is currently in the process of sharing this with our congregation. And that's the way it was with us before Christ came. We were like children; we were slaves to the basic spiritual principles of this world. But when the right time came, God sent his Son, born of a woman, subject to the law. God sent him to buy freedom for us who were slaves to the law, so that he could adopt us as his very own children. And because we are his children, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, prompting us to call out, "Abba, Father." Now you are no longer a slave but God's own child. And since you are his child, God has made you his heir.

Growth- Believing in the great commission to expand the family of God in Jesus name, we invite people into our lives and into the life of our church family. That is the way it is with us: When we were minors, we were just like slaves ordered around by simple instructions (the tutors and administrators of this world), with no say in the conduct of our own lives.

But when the time arrived that was set by God the Father,
God sent his Son, born among us of a woman, born under the conditions of the law so that he might redeem those of us who have been kidnapped by the law. Thus we have been set free to experience our rightful heritage. You can tell for sure that you are now fully adopted as his own children because God sent the Spirit of his Son into our lives crying out, "Papa! Father!" Doesn't that privilege of intimate conversation with God make it plain that you are not a slave, but a child? And if you are a child, you're also an heir, with complete access to the inheritance.
