Handwritten Bible—The Gospel of John

Deeply engaging with Scripture is important for all Christians, especially Methodists. John Wesley described Methodists as a people who had been raised up to spread 'Scriptural Holiness' throughout the land, and recognized that immersion in Scripture was one key way in which the people of God grew into maturity and faith. He also believed that searching the Scriptures was a 'means of grace'. We are going to tackle a project during Eastertide – the time between Easter and Pentecost – to "engage in scripture in a new way." We will write (or print) the entire gospel of John as a congregation, as copied from the NRSV. Copies of the finished handwritten gospel will be available on Pentecost Sunday, May 15, 2016 during our Change The World weekend.

Ways you can participate:

+ handwrite a portion of Scripture – there will be a table in the narthex where individuals can stop for a moment and write out a verse or two of the gospel of John. (Directions are at the table, as well as pens and paper.)

sign up as a small group, Sunday School class, or as a family to handwrite one entire chapter of the gospel of John. Call the church office at 584-2133 and speak to Pastor Amy to receive your packet (with paper and directions.)

+ illustrate a chapter heading page – the gospel of John has 21 chapters. Groups that are doing a chapter have the option of also doing the chapter heading page if someone in the group or family has an artistic bent. Pastor Amy will know which chapters still need illustrators.

+ submit an illustration that may be chosen as front cover of the gospel.

WHY are we undertaking this spiritual discipline?

No English speaking person "needs" to write out the English Bible. Most of us have several copies and versions on our bookshelves. The Bible is available in print, online, and even on our mobile devices. But we want to invest time and effort in Scripture in a fresh and powerful way.

We trust that time spent "writing" the words of scripture will bring us new insight and understanding into the ministry of our Lord and Savior. Our diversity in handwriting, ages, creativity and cultures will be "united" as one in the gospel of John.

John 17:17-18. 20a

Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. I ask not only on behalf of these, but also on behalf of those who will believe in me through their word, that they may all be one.

Josh Kouri is a native of Albuquerque, New Mexico. In 2003, he graduated from New Mexico State University in Las Cruces (Go Aggies!) with a B.A. in Government. During college, Josh interned in the Washington, DC office of Senator Pete V. Domenici of New Mexico.

After college, Josh discerned a call to ordained ministry while serving as the youth director at St. Paul's UMC, Las Cruces, NM. In 2008, he began seminary at Perkins School of Theology, Southern Methodist University in Dallas. There he was a recipient of the Perkins Prothro Fellowship, an honor awarded by Perkins to three entering students each year who demonstrate promise and commitment to ministry. He was also one of 20 seminary students from across the country to be selected by the Fund for Theological Education as a Ministry Fellow.

Josh was ordained as an elder in the Northwest Texas Conference in 2014. He currently serves as the pastor of Trinity United Methodist Church in



Amarillo, Texas. He is also a member of the Lewis Fellows, a leadership development program offered for younger clergy by Wesley Theological Seminary.

When he is not busy at church, Josh likes to ski, hike, or fish. He can also make a mean plate of green chile enchiladas. Josh loves the borderland, having lived in Las Cruces for eight years and El Paso for one. He is very excited to serve alongside the church-pioneers at the Ridge and Western Hills UMC.
