IT'S NOT CHURCH, IT'S HOME

The following was shared during an offering moment in worship last month. We appreciate Torey Moye's willingness to share this and believe it is worth hearing again. We hope it will encourage and inspire you.

When I was a kid, I was going to grow up and cure cancer, after becoming a princess of course. My classmates had big dreams for the future too. There were future police officers, astronauts, firemen, doctors, lawyers, singers, actors, and even the occasional President. No matter what the aspiration though, I think they all boiled down to one major factor: We wanted to fix the world, or at least make

it better. And though each of us may have had a different way of getting it there, none of us saw any reason why we couldn't be a part of that.

As we get older, we tend to become more cynical, thinking that only a special few, or only the rich or the powerful can change the world. No one knew exactly what Jesus would be when He came, but everyone who was waiting for Him knew He was coming to fix the world. I think John the Baptizer, Peter, Andrew, and others were like all of us as children—they were looking for a way to heal the world around them, and they knew the one who could do that was the Messiah.

Andrew brought his brother Simon to meet Jesus, saying, "We have found the Messiah," which

makes me think they had been actively looking for Him, not just waiting for Him to get there. And the fact that they followed Him makes me think they didn't just want Him to fix things; they wanted to be a part of it. And when Jesus saw them following He didn't ask to see their resumes and qualifications, or look at their past wrongs or reputations. He invited them to come along.

Likewise, I think that invitation is extended to all of us. If we are actively looking we see Him in the brokenness, in the hungry and thirsty, in the stranger, the sick, and the prisoner. He may have given us each different gifts and different work to do here, but in all of it He can work through us to fix what's broken. I think the only question left is how we choose to answer the invitation. Do we still want to be a part of what God is doing here, and like children do we still believe we can?
