Based in Shiprock, New Mexico, the ministry covers the eastern half of the Navajo Reservation.

The mission of The Four Corners Native American Ministry is to train pastors and leaders to be in ministry to the Navajos, always pointing them to Christ's love.

The **Rev. George Miller** is a missionary with the General Board of Global Ministries of The United Methodist Church serving as coordinator of international and

migrant ministries for the United Methodist Church in Germany (Evangelisch-methodistische Kirche in Deutschland). He works out of Frankfurt.

The central focus of George's work is outreach to and development of international and migrant United Methodist ministries in Germany. This covers asylum seekers, migrants, students, undocumented workers, residents with foreign backgrounds, and military personnel and their families. George relates both to the resident bishop of the Germany Central Conference and the International Council of The United Methodist Church in Germany. He began this ministry in mid-2014, after having served in 2012 and 2013 as a pastor with the German State Protestant Church (Evangelische Landeskirche in Baden) in the city of Schopfheim.





George Miller is a native of North Carolina and an ordained elder of the New Mexico Annual Conference. From 2006 to 2012 he was chaplain and vice president for religious affairs at Lydia Patterson Institute, a mission institution of the South Central Jurisdiction in El Paso, Texas. Earlier, he was pastor of United Methodist congregations in La Mesa, New Mexico, and Anthony, Texas.
